

Be a Good Example Bingo



In the Classroom

1. Print a large version for the class or individual copies for students.
2. Set a goal: Let's try to get a Bingo by the end of the week!
3. When students demonstrate positive behavior, allow them to mark off a square.
4. Once a row is completed, reward the class (extra recess, a fun game, class recognition).
5. Rotate the Bingo cards or create new ones for ongoing engagement.

Alternative Idea: Turn it into a team competition, groups of students work together to complete a row first!

At Home

1. Print the Bingo card and place it somewhere visible (fridge, bedroom door, etc.).
2. Encourage your child to complete at least one square per day by setting a good example.
3. When they complete a task, they can mark it off, color it in, or put a sticker on the square.
4. Once they get five in a row (Bingo!), celebrate with a small reward, like extra playtime, a favorite meal, or a special outing.
5. Keep going to see if they can complete the whole card over time!

Bonus Challenge: If your child completes the whole Bingo card, have them create their version with new ways to set a good example.
