

Vocabulary Strategies



Modeling

- Use FF vocabulary in your interactions with your students.
- Reinforce the language; whether it's during moments of conflict or challenge, or in moments of

Consistency

- Add FF terms into your daily routines; speak them aloud.
 - For example, "We are practicing active listening at the assembly today."
- Display vocabulary words in your classroom. Print out the slides from the LMS and add them to your word wall. If you don't have a word wall, display them somewhere else where students can see them. This will help keep them top of mind for you during your instruction, as well!

Promote Reflection

- Use these words in your Morning Message or during your closing meeting. Keep them alive long past the lesson. A question for a closing meeting could be, "How did you step out of your comfort zone today?"

Integration

- Use FF vocabulary to guide transitions between activities or classes.
- Use FF vocabulary in your instructions or verbal directions and thinking prompts.

Positive Reinforcement

- Celebrate and acknowledge when students use the vocabulary correctly. For example, "I noticed you used the word "disagreement" when explaining a challenge to me."
