

Figurative Language and Emotions

A simile compares two different things using the words “like” or “as.”

A metaphor compares two different things without using “like” or “as,” usually by saying that one thing is another or that one thing has qualities of another.

Example of a simile: Luna’s tears were like raindrops as she cried.

Example of a metaphor: Blake’s anger was a volcano waiting to erupt.
