

# Fly Five Lesson Sequencing

Fly Five offers the flexibility to meet the unique needs of your students and school community. While lessons can be taught in any order across competencies, there are two primary ways to sequence your lessons:

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## C.A.R.E.S. Competency Sequence

- This sequence follows a structured C.A.R.E.S. Competency model in which all lessons within one competency are taught before progressing to the next.
- Educators begin with “C” (Cooperation) and proceed in the established C.A.R.E.S. order (Cooperation, Assertiveness, Responsibility, Empathy, Self-Control).
- This approach is ideal for classrooms new to Fly Five and seeking to establish consistency and a clear progression throughout the year or school-wide.

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## Hopes and Goals Setting Module Sequence

- This needs-based pacing sequence uses the Hopes & Goals Setting Module and SETI data to identify and prioritize C.A.R.E.S. competencies based on current classroom needs.
- Teachers deliver all lessons in a competency as a unit, starting with the most relevant area instead of the standard C.A.R.E.S. sequence.
- This sequence is ideal for Fly Five experienced educators or those looking for a custom sequence.
